Subj: Orders relieving you of all active duty incident to your retirement
Ref: (a) Article C-10201, BuPers Manual
(b) BuPers Instruction 1900.1C
(c) Sections 1 and 5, Chapter 14, Part C, BuPers Manual
(d) BuPers Instruction 1811.1B

1. Your request to be transferred to the retired list was approved by the Secretary of the Navy, effective 1 December 1963.
2. When directed by your commanding officer in November you will regard yourself detached from all duties which may have been assigned you. In accordance with references (a) and (b), you will proceed to a port in the continental United States and upon arrival further proceed to the appropriate naval activity nearest to port of debarkation and report to the commanding officer thereof for temporary duty awaiting your retirement.
3. You are hereby authorized to delay until 21 November 1963 (provided said delay is not in excess of leave earned) in reporting at the above mentioned activity in compliance with these orders, such delay to count as leave, any portion of which may be taken prior to or after arrival in the United States. Keep your old and new station advised of your address, using Form NavPers 3036.
4. When directed by the commanding officer of the above mentioned activity on 30 November 1963 you will regard yourself detached from all duties and will proceed to your home of selection. You will regard yourself relieved of all active duty in the Navy effective at 2400 on date of detachment.
5. On 1 December 1963 you will be transferred to the retired list with the grade of Commander and with the retired pay of that grade, pursuant to the provisions of U. S. Code, Title 10, Section(s) 6323.
6. Attention is invited to references (c) and (d) concerning general information affecting the retirement of officers.

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7. If you are hospitalized at any time during the period preceding the date of your retirement, you should advise the Chief of Naval Personnel by message concerning the diagnosis, prognosis, and probable period of hospitalization.
8. You will not be required to take a new physical examination unless a material change in your physical condition has occurred subsequent to your recent retirement physical examination.
9. It is requested that you report your mail address in accordance with Article B-2206 (7), Bureau of Naval Personnel Manual.
10. Accounting data 1741453.2254 22/54600 N5K4 250113 CIC 3/4/453/54/50113
11. Enter in item 11c, DD Form 214: (These orders), 56P, Voluntary retirement - After more than twenty years' service - Commissioned officers - 10 USC 6323 or 6327.
12. Travel via government transportation is directed outside the continental United States where available, otherwise commercial transportation is authorized. While traveling via government air outside the continental United States, class THREE priority is certified. Advise the appropriate command having cognizance of transportation when you are available for transportation to the continental United States.
13. Submit NAVPERS 2850 to BUPERS (Pers B333). Enter TCC PL25010 in block one and BUPERS ORDER NR in block seven.
